

“We Will Walk One Hundred Miles...”

Welcome to the Time Stop treasure hunt. From Friday 30th April to Friday 7th May the residents and staff are taking part in the Captain Tom 100 Challenge. In honour of Sir Tom Moore, charities are organising fundraising activities that involve 100, and we are supporting YMCA Trinity Group.

At Time Stop, we are working together to walk, run, cycle 100 miles. To help clock up the miles and take our minds off the walking we have designed a Treasure Hunt.

It is a 3 mile circular route, there a hundred clues to solve. The answers will be found on posters, signs, street items, buildings that you will pass or that you can see from the route. Some of the clues ask you to spot particular buildings.

You don't have to do the whole route in one go and families may just want to do a section. If this is the case the station section has lots of clues to find. Please just confirm at the end of the sheet how much you did as every step helps towards our 100 miles!

This sheet contains all the directions that are in bold type. The clues shown in the order that you will pass them. So if you get to a direction and you have not seen one of the clues between the directions – you have missed it! But don't worry there are 100 to find! You can always look again!!
